PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of 48 units from the BTHEM List comprising -

- 16 units for BTHEM Core Courses; and
- 16 units for a major from BTHEM Majors; and
- 16 units for either:
 - o a second major from BTHEM Majors; or
 - General Elective Courses.

Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1 . Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3.

General Electives can come from almost any other undergraduate program at UQ providing you have met the prerequisites; they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program, nor a prerequisite for entry to your program (e.g. you cannot gain credit for MATH1040 if you studied Mathematical Methods/Mathematics B in high school and used it to meet the maths prerequisite for the program).
