What is an exemption?

- If you have completed a course/s in your **Undergraduate** studies that you think is the same as a course in your postgraduate program, you may be eligible for an **exemption** from compulsory course/s.
- Receiving an exemption **does not reduce the number of courses that you need to complete to graduate**. You need to replace any exempted compulsory courses with an elective from your program's course list.


What is Credit?

- If you have completed equivalent courses at a **Postgraduate** Level, you may be entitled to credit.
- Receiving credit **reduces the number of courses you need to complete to graduate**. You don't need to replace courses for which you are awarded credit.

What is a prerequisite course?

Course(s) that **must have been previously passed** to be able to enrol in a particular course. They provide the appropriate foundation knowledge to progress to the next course.

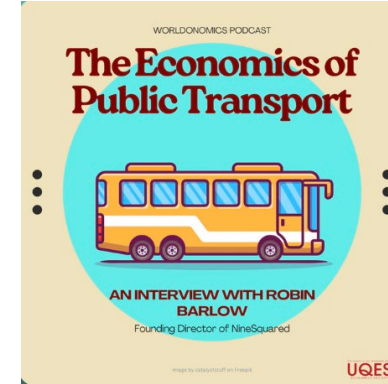
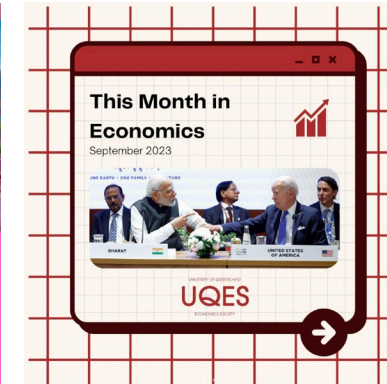
