Program Guidelines

You must complete a total of 48* units from the BCom List comprising –

- 16 units for all BCom Core Courses; and
- 16 units for one major from BCom Majors; and
- 16 units for either:
 - a second major from BCom Majors; or
 - General Elective Courses

***No more than 8 units can be at level 1 excluding core courses. Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3.**

General Electives can come from almost any other undergraduate program at UQ providing you have met the prerequisites; they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program, nor a prerequisite for entry to your program (e.g. you cannot gain credit for MATH1040 if you studied Mathematical Methods/Mathematics B in high school and used it to meet the maths prerequisite for the program).
