Program update for MBus Supply Chain Management field (or major)

Proposal to discontinue Supply Chain Management field of study

- Following a comprehensive review, the Business School has proposed to discontinue the MBus Supply Chain Management field of study for new students commencing from Semester 2, 2025.
- We will continue to provide the existing Supply Chain Management courses offered in the International Business field of study – IBUS7316 International Supply Chains & IBUS7322 International Service Operations Management.
- The remaining fields available in the Master of Business program will not be affected by this proposal.

What does this mean for you?



New students commencing in Semester 1, 2025 will not be affected by this proposed change and will have the opportunity to complete their program requirements.

Students commencing from Semester 2, 2025 will not be able to complete the Supply Chain Management field of study (or major).



MBus Supply Chain Management field of study requirements

- Complete 10 units comprising:
 - 2 units (1 course) for Supply Chain
 Management Compulsory Courses
 from either:
 - IBUS7316 International Supply Chains, or
 - IBUS7322 International Service Operations Management
 - 8 units credit upon completion of the MITx Supply Chain Management MicroMasters® - you are required to obtain a Verified Certificate for each module.



Supply Chain Management

Supply Chain Management students are required to complete MITx MicroMasters® in Supply Chain Management in addition to their UQ courses.

- The MicroMasters Program in Supply Chain from MITx is an advanced, professional, graduate-level foundation in Supply Chain Management.
- Students who successfully earn the Micromasters credential will receive 8 units (equivalent to four courses or semester worth of study) credit towards their program.
- The Micromasters program is self-paced within certain enrolment periods and delivered by MIT via edX platform. You will need to manage your learning in this program yourself.
- Students must abide by edX and MITx Honor Code when completing assessments.
- International students in Australia on a student visa must complete all MITx courses for the Master of Business program at UQ before the degree can be awarded. If any MITx courses are incomplete, students will have to return to their home country and finish these courses online.
