- 16 units for one major from BTHEM Majors; and
- 16 units for either:
 - o a second major from BTHEM Majors; or
 - General Elective Courses.

*Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1. Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3.

General Electives can come from almost any other undergraduate program at UQ providing you have met the prerequisites, they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program, nor a prerequisite for entry to your program (e.g. you cannot gain credit for MATH1040 if you studied Mathematical Methods/Mathematics B in high school and used it to meet the maths prerequisite for the program).
