- On successful completion of the Graduate Certificate in Business, with a GPA of at least 4.50 on UQ's 7-point scale, you will be eligible to articulate into the 2-year Master of Business program, with full credit will be retained.
- The total study time is the same no matter if you commenced directly in the Master of Business program.
- This program does not offer a pathway into the 1.5-year Master of Business.
- All attempted grades, including failed grades, will be taken into consideration when calculating your GPA.

Fields of Study

Students must complete at least one field of study with the option to complete a second field



Research pathway in 2-year Master of Business

Complete research coursework as a pathway to higher degree by research study (MPhil or PhD)

- High-achieving students may have the opportunity to complete research coursework (including project or thesis) as a pathway into higher degree by research in the future.
- Learn research methodology skills through Honours and Business Research Methods coursework
- Complete independent research completed by the student under the supervision of a Business School academic.


What do you have to do?
