- On successful completion of the GCTHEM, with a GPA of at least 4.50 on UQ's 7-point scale, you will be eligible to articulate into the 2-year MTHEM program, with full credit will be retained.
- The total study time is the same no matter if you commenced directly in the MTHEM 2-year program.
- This program does not offer a pathway into the 1.5-year MTHEM.
- All attempted grades, including failed grades, will be taken into consideration when calculating your GPA.

Research pathway in 2-year MTHEM

Complete research coursework as a pathway to higher degree by research study (MPhil or PhD)

- High-achieving students may have the opportunity to complete research coursework (including project or thesis) as a pathway into higher degree by research in the future.
- Learn research methodology skills through Honours and Business Research Methods coursework
- Complete independent research completed by the student under the supervision of a Business School academic.


