

We have two programs - MEcon and MIntEcon&F









How do I enroll in courses?





What if I have studied similar courses before?

What is an exemption?

- If you have completed a course/s in your Undergraduate studies that you think is the same as a course in your postgraduate program you may be eligible for an exemption from compulsory course/s.
- Receiving an exemption does not reduce the number of courses that you need to complete to graduate. You need to replace any exempted compulsory courses with an elective from your program's course list.

What is credit?

- If you have completed equivalent courses at a **Postgraduate** Level, you may be entitled to credit.
- Receiving credit reduces the number of courses you need to complete to graduate. You don't need to replace courses for which you are awarded credit.



Enrolment dates – Semester 2 2025

Due date to enrol – it is your responsibility to enrol in at least one course by this date

Domestic students: 18/07/2025

International students: 25/07/2025

Final date for addition of courses or alteration of enrolment – End of Week 2: 08/08/2025

Census date – last date to drop courses or cancel enrolment without financial liability: 31/08/2025

Last date to drop courses or cancel enrolment without academic penalty: 30/09/2025

After you enrol in course on mySI-net, you will need to register your preferred times through **My Timetable** (our class allocation system) through your **my.UQ** dashboard.


