

- On successful completion of the Graduate Certificate in Business, with a GPA of at least 4.00 on UQ's 7-point scale, you will be eligible to articulate into the 2-year Master of Business program, with full credit will be retained.
- The total study time is the same no matter if you commenced directly in the Master of Business program.
- This program does not offer a pathway into the 1.5-year Master of Business.
- All attempted grades, including failed grades, will be taken into consideration when calculating your GPA.



Research pathway in 2-year Master of Business

Complete research coursework as a pathway to higher degree by research study (MPhil or PhD)

- High-achieving students may have the opportunity to complete research coursework (including project or thesis) as a pathway into higher degree by research in the future.
- Learn research methodology skills through Honours and Business Research Methods coursework
- Complete independent research completed by the student under the supervision of a Business School academic.

Work integrated learning opportunities in your Master's program

Gain consultancy project or work experience with an industry partner for academic credit

- **RBUS7888 Business Industry Consultancy Project** and **RBUS7999 Business Industry Placement** are available in your Master's program.
- Opportunity to apply conceptual knowledge to the real world via a professional placement or industry consultancy project (group project) for credit.
- Build your employability skills required for the transition to industry.
- Students must be in their final year and have a program GPA of at least 4.0 on UQ's 7-point scale to be considered.
