PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of 48* units from the BBusMan course list comprising -

- 18 units of compulsory courses from Part A; and
- 12 units from one major in Part B (at least 6 units must be from level 3 courses); and
- 18 units from either:
 - (1) 12 units for a second major from Part B (at least 6 units must be from level 3 courses); and 6 units of general electives from Part B or C or almost any undergraduate program in the University; or
 - (2) 16 units of general electives from Part B or C or almost any undergraduate program in the University; and 2 units from Part B or C.

*No more than 4 units (2 courses) can be at level 1 excluding Part A compulsory courses. An exception applies for the Real Estate and Development major. Refer to the BBusMan rules for further information.

General Electives can come from almost any other undergraduate program at UQ providing you have met the prerequisites; they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program, nor a prerequisite for entry to your program (e.g. you cannot gain credit for MATH1040 if you studied Mathematics B in high school and used it to meet the maths prerequisite for the program).
