## PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of 48\* units from the BBusMan course list comprising -

- 18 units of compulsory courses from Part A; and
- 12 units from one major in Part B (at least 6 units must be from level 3 courses); and
- 18 units for either:
  - (1) 12 units for a second major from Part B (at least 6 units must be from level 3 courses); and 6 units of general electives from Part B or C or almost any undergraduate program in the University approved by the Executive Dean; or
  - (2) 16 units of general electives from Part B or C or almost any undergraduate program in the University approved by the Executive Dean; and 2 units from Part B or C.

\*No more than 4 units can be at level 1 excluding Part A compulsory courses. Refer to the BBusMan rules for further information.

**General Electives** can come from almost any other undergraduate program at UQ providing you have met the prerequisites; they are not incompatible with any of the courses in your program, nor a prerequisite to your program (e.g. you cannot gain credit for MATH1040 if you studied Mathematics B in high school and used it to meet the maths prerequisite for the program).
