## PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of 48 units from the BEcon course list, comprising -

- 16 units for all BEcon Core Courses; and
- 32 units for either
  - (1) Students who wish to complete two majors:
    - 16 units for one major from BEcon Majors (with at least 8 units at level 3); and
    - 16 units for a second major from BEcon Majors (with at least 8 units at level 3);

**OR**

  - (2) Students who wish to complete one major:
    - 16 units for one major from BEcon Majors (with at least 8 units at level 3); and
    - 16 units of general elective courses;

**OR**

  - (3) Students who do not wish to complete a major:
    - 16 units of BEcon Flexible Core Courses (with at least 8 units at level 3); and
    - 16 units of general elective courses.

Selected courses must include at most 24 units at level 1.  
Selected courses must include at least 8 units at level 3.
